SEATTLE —Humanities Washington kicks off the 2012 season of its popular Think & Drink series with a Jan. 11 discussion about *Alien Encounters: Sci-Fi Movies, the Cold War and Today*. The conversation will be led by Robert Horton, author and film critic for *The (Everett, Wash.) Herald* and KUOW, and will feature film clips from classic sci-fi films such as *Invasion of the Body Snatchers* and *The Day the Earth Stood Still*. This free event gets underway at 7 p.m. at Naked City Brewery & Taphouse, a Think & Drink programming partner and exclusive Seattle location.
